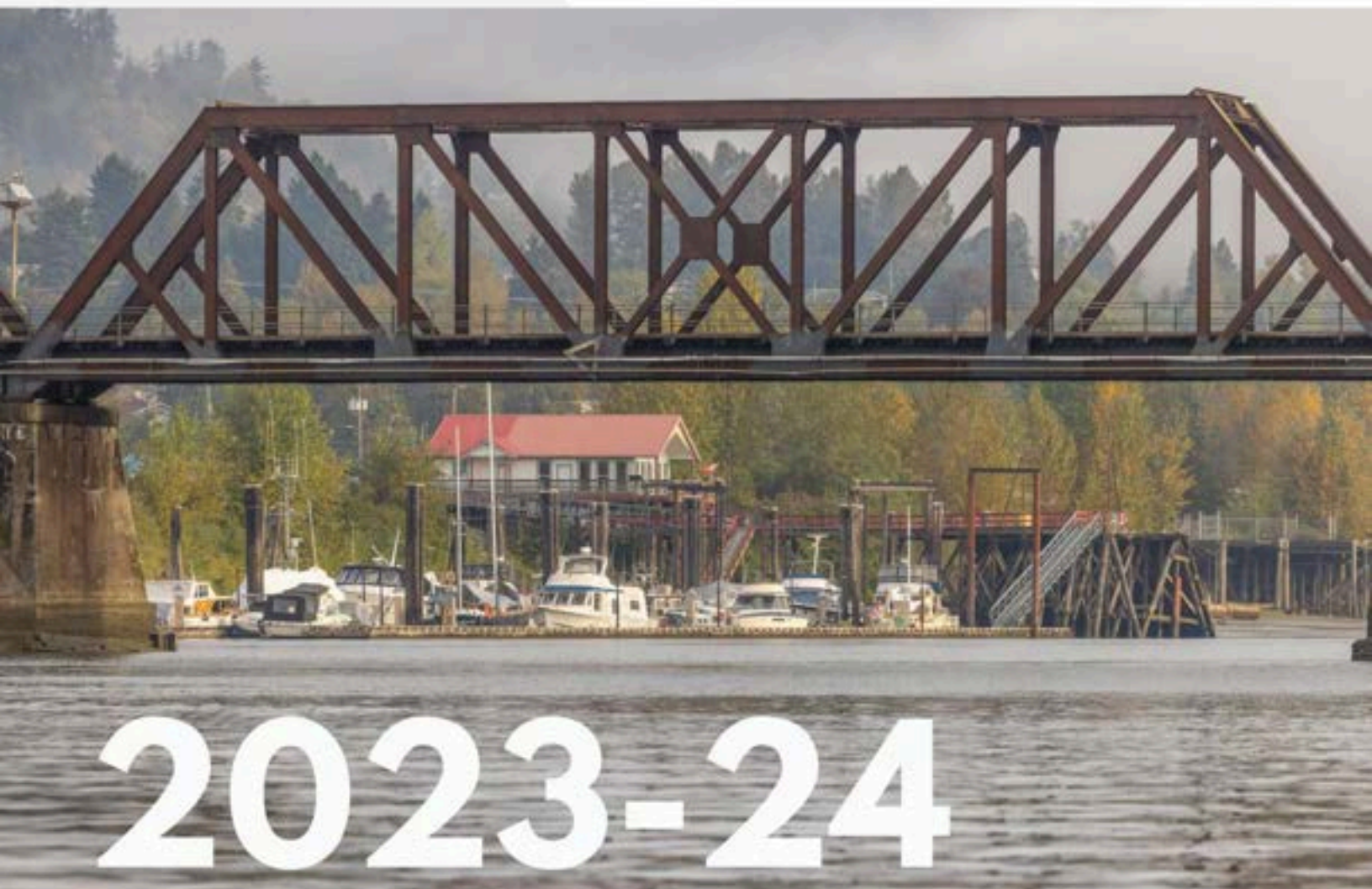

A MESSAGE FROM OUR CHAIR AND EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

Community Futures (CF), funded by Pacific Economic Development Canada, empowers local entrepreneurs and small businesses. We

offer advisory services, self-employment training, business plan development, loans, and community initiatives in Mission, Kent/Agassiz, Harrison Hot Springs, and nearby areas. With a volunteer board and dedicated staff, we're committed to helping small businesses thrive.

Thank you to our board and staff for their dedication to CF North Fraser and our communities.

We are proud to share our remarkable achievements for 2023-24, surpassing previous records in several areas. Notably, our advisory services saw a 41% increase, thanks to our new Business Development Officer and the addition of an events coordinator this past summer. Lending activities led to a 450% increase in job creation compared to last year.

We also welcomed new board members, contributing a total of 656 volunteer hours. Our strategic focus on education has been robust, with presentations to Mission Senior School, Riverside College, and the University of the Fraser Valley. Community partnerships flourished as we participated in 29 projects within our service area. Additionally, we have strengthened representation regional and collaboration with Community Futures South Fraser and Stó:lō Community Futures.

Equity and Inclusion We value all types of differences, backgrounds and lived experiences in the development of our organization so that people who come to us feel safe and empowered to succeed.

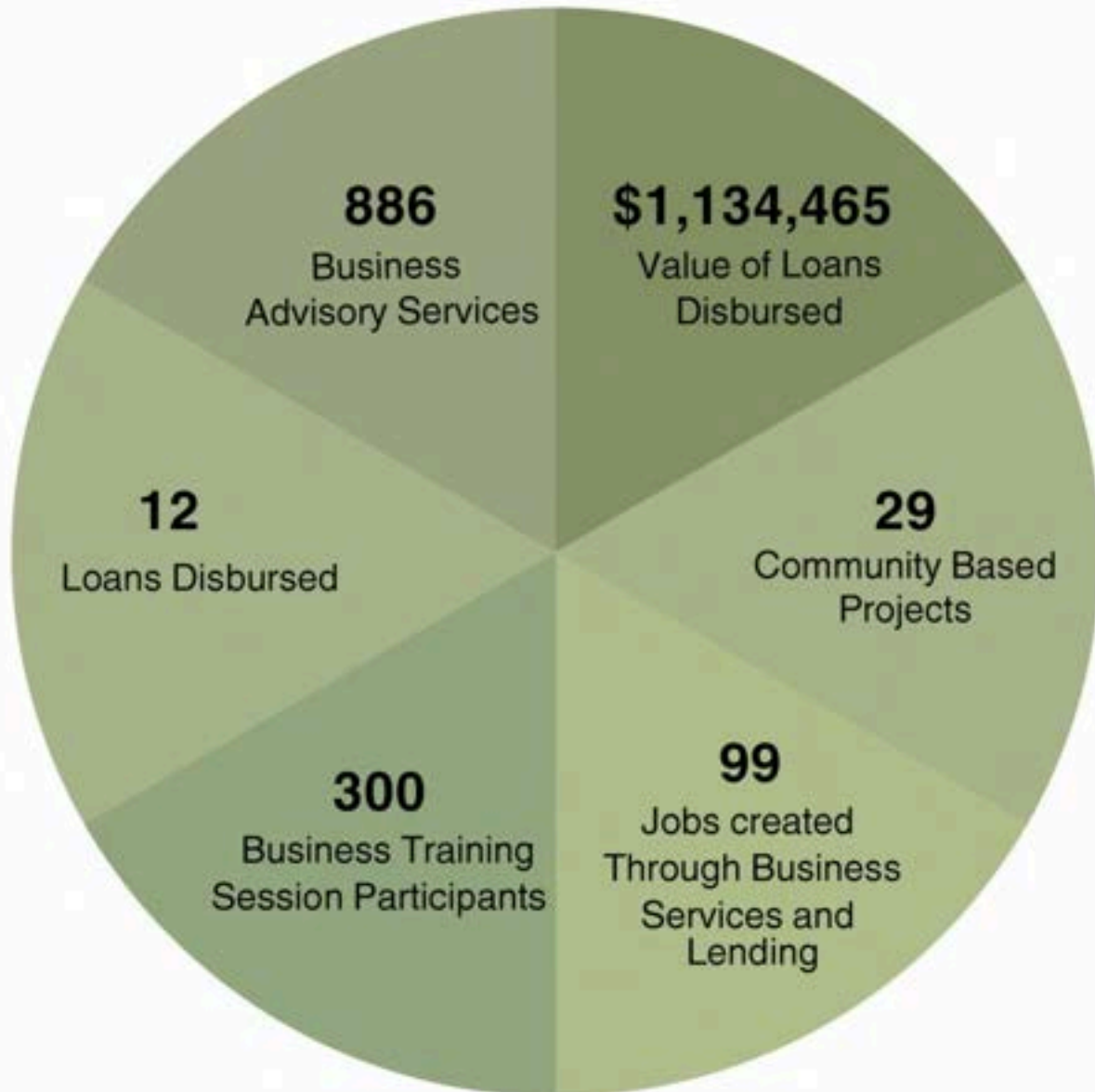

Our students attended the Twilight Artisan Market every Thursday, connecting with over **77** unique vendors and spreading awareness of our services.



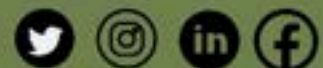
Sponsoring local events and community initiatives helps Community Futures North Fraser build vital bonds with community partners and gain positive recognition across the community.

That is the story of how Jessica and Amy met. They were both working at the same dental office in side-by-side operatories. AVO Everlasting Essentials Inc. (AVO) is now a women-owned company founded by Jessica Drader and Amy Pannu, both Registered Dental Hygienists living in Mission British Columbia. Jessica grew up in Abbotsford, and Amy was from Aldergrove. Their Fraser Valley upbringing led them both to Mission in adulthood, and that is how the found Community Futures. Literally, inside of a magazine cover! They contacted the office and were met with guidance and support for the application process and beyond. The funding and resources from Community Futures allowed AVO to launch in the summer/fall of 2023 with a patent-pending, sustainable toothbrush and a natural, fluoride-free toothpaste in recyclable tubes. From co-workers to friends and now business partners, the possibilities are endless for Amy and Jessica.

We recognized the need to reduce plastic waste for the sake of future generations. We wanted to create an oral care product line that not only aligned with environmental values but also provided a clutter-free modernization of the bathroom counter, which is why AVO's toothbrush allows for effective bristle air-drying and magnetic storage options. We also felt it was time to update the daily oral care routine to make it more aesthetically appealing.

AVO Everlasting Essentials Inc. aims to offer consciously designed products, providing an all-natural oral health care solution with a modern aesthetic while contributing to a cleaner planet.
